NEED TO DO SOME SPRING CLEANING ON YOUR FACEBOOK ACCOUNT? By Kyle Petreycik | April 22, 2013 - 01:30PM



This Saturday, Parsons hosted <u>Rhizome's Seven on Seven</u> conference — a unique art and technology event that carefully selects seven artists to work with seven technologists for a one-day-only intense session of design and planning. On the following day, each group presented their projects.

One of this year's best was a collaboration between Mexican-Canadian <u>electronic artist Rafael Lozano-Hemmer</u> and American entrepreneur/engineer <u>Harper Reed</u>, who have produced one the most useful Facebook tools I've seen in quite some time. Over the course of their twenty-four hour "assignment," the duo created <u>Friendfracker</u> – a service that deletes up to ten of your Facebook friends, all of which automated and chosen randomly. When asked about why the service wouldn't allow you to see *which* friends were deleted, the artist said the following: "You don't know which friends it deletes. That's the art."

Luckily, if your friend count has truly proven to be out of control, the service *is* cookie-based, meaning that you can use it multiple times as long as you clear your history or use a different browser each time.
